



Procedure to Apply and Obtain an F or J Student Visa

In order to obtain your student visa in a timely manner and arrive at Florida Gulf Coast University, it is important you pay close attention to the checklist of information attached. Review carefully your I-20 or DS-2019 and the pre-arrival orientation information packet as they contain valuable information that will aid you in your arrival to U.S. and FGCU.

1. Read the information in the Consular Section of the US Embassy's website in your country, or the nearest US consulate: <http://usembassy.state.gov/> and http://travel.state.gov/visa/temp/types/types_1268.html
2. Pay the SEVIS Fee at www.fmjfee.com upon receiving your I-20 or DS-2019 form.
Locate your SEVIS ID number (N000..... on the top right corner of your I-20 or DS-2019 form). In the I-901 SEVIS fee form you should provide your name, date of birth and other information exactly as indicated in the I-20 or DS-2019. (Make sure you print a receipt of payment for your records.) **The SEVIS fee for I-20 holders is \$350 and for DS-2019 holders is \$220.**
3. Before scheduling the Visa Interview Appointment, complete the DS-160 Visa Application at <https://ceac.state.gov/genniv/>
4. Schedule a visa interview appointment for a non-immigrant visa by visiting the US embassy's website. (Remember, if you are coming to the US on an initial DS-2019 or I-20 form, you will be allowed to enter the U.S. up to 30 days prior to the first day of classes.)
5. Pay the Visa application fee. Most U.S. Embassies require the equivalent of **\$160 USD** Interview Fee to be paid prior to the interview date (often at a U.S. Embassy approved local bank or institution). Bring the receipt with you to the visa interview.
6. At the visa interview, bring: One passport size picture with you. Proof of Visa fee payment, SEVIS (I-901) Fee receipt, Receipt of DS-160 form; original I-20/DS-2019, valid Passport, the FGCU letter of acceptance and the pre-arrival orientation information packet, as well as sufficient evidence of socio-economic ties in your home country. Remember that advance travel planning and early visa application are important since visa applications are subject to a greater degree of scrutiny than in the past.
