Important Notes:

- All prerequisite courses must be completed with a C or higher (a grade of C- is not acceptable).
- **Students must complete BSC 1085C & BSC 1086C prior to submitting supplemental application.**
- Students must be admitted to FGCU prior to submitting a supplemental application. Information about the supplemental application can be found here: <https://www.fgcu.edu/mariebcollege/nursing/nursing-bsn#BSNProgramAdmissionProcess>
- Students must complete the Test of Essential Academic Skills Test (TEAS) prior to BSN supplemental application deadline, with scores calculated for BSN Program applicants. **Please note:** The original (first-attempt) TEAS exam results must be submitted as part of the application
- The BSN program is a **limited access**, full-time program offered for traditional first degree students. **Admission is competitive.** <https://www.fgcu.edu/admissionsandaid/undergraduateadmissions/limitedaccessprograms>
- Student progression is based on the Nursing Program of Study and is a cohort model.
- Students are required to plan an alternate major based on the nature of limited access programs.

Students are **strongly encouraged** to complete these courses as part of their AA degree to stay on track for a timely graduation. Any remaining prerequisite courses not completed during the AA may delay graduation.
