4.a.) Faculty Senate President's Report	Jamie MacDonald	 President Martin will be attending the 12/4/20 Faculty Senate meeting for a Q & A with faculty. A survey will be sent to faculty prior to meeting to solicit questions for the President. Draft regulation on PLA's went out 10/29/20 and
		generated a large number of correspondences from faculty, a Chair, and two Associate Deans from CAS. The Provost will organize a meeting to address, or alleviate, any final concerns.
		Dr. Mark Rieger has been named Executive Vice President and Provost. He is scheduled to start January, 2021.
		Dr. Shawn Felton and Mr. James Nathan have been named Co-Acting Deans of Marieb College of Health & Human Services.
		BOT met 10/29 virtually
		Dr. Cordova reported on Student Success. o FTIC are down slightly from last year (-6.2%) but total enrollment is up by 2.5%.
		o 37% of the FTIC are first generation students.
		 58% of the FTIC plan on working to finance their education.
		o 44% of the FTIC cite mental health as a significant concern.
		 48% of the FTIC felt confident in their ability to adjust to virtual learning.
		 4-year graduation rate continues to increase, but is still relatively low (41%).
		Housing is at approximately 82%. FGCU in the highest of the SUS. Needs to improve over the next year to meet the threshold of covering the bond payment.
		44.38 acres of property has transferred to FGCU from Lee County with Alico frontage. This property will be delegated as recreational fields.
		Workforce housing project was presented to BOT regarding property near Gulf Coast Town Center,

behind movie theatre. This would be a joint project that would offer below market value housing for future faculty. BOT not in favor due to university "not in the real estate business" and not hiring faculty at this time. Recommendation is to use for auxillary purposes. BOG met 11/5/20 and reappointed two trustees (Fogg and Montgomery). Governor DeSantis appointed Edward "Tee" Baur to the FGCU BOT. Textbooks need to be ordered to be compliant with the BOG regulations for Textbook and Instructional Materials Affordabiility (BOG 8.003). Excellence nominations are due by 5 pm, 11/16/20. Letter of nomination should be sent to Provost office. Please send to Tracie Beck trbeck@fgcu.edu Budget being reviewed by David Vasquez. BOG most 4.b.)Provost James likely will have a 6 million reduction for FGCU. No Llorens Report Llorens concern at this time and should be able to cover this reduction. FGCU is one of two schools returning after Thanksgiving (FGCU and FIU). Students are requesting pass/fail option. No decision has been made. COVID cases on campus are declining. Marieb College of Health & Human Services Clinical Lab Services Program was recently reaccreditated. FGCU is keeping abreast of storm ETA. Decisions will be made as storm becomes more predictable. Dr. Mark Rieger is the new Provost and will start January, Motion to extend 5 2021. Dr. Llorens will be assisting with the transition. minutes Van Duijn/Fortney **Discussion:** Komisar: Faculty appointments were made by Senate President to include faculty from different units to discuss university reorganization. Concern no discussions have been conducted with faculty. **Llorens:** This is ongoing and meetings will be scheduled with President Martin and task force through spring, 2021. Implementation is not planned until fall, 2021. Paine: If contingency plans are in place in case of BOG cuts to FGCU, and this does not occur, would like to suggest "vote for faculty"/invest in faculty instead of spending.

Llorens: We will have a better understanding as we know resources.

Clemons: Reminded faculty 11/12/20 is the Provost's promotion workship which will be conducted in a virtual format. Letter of intent due 11/30.

MacDonald: Concern there maybe a hesitancy for promotion this year.

Lura: Voiced a desire for President Martin to address the reorganization with Faculty Senate before decisions are made. Disclosure of process would be appreciated by faculty to be clear on motivation of process.

Llorens: President Martin has been clear. Academic leaders have been involved.

MacDonald: States he will articulate this desire for a meeting to President Martin regarding reorganization.

Everham: Reiterated need for Faculty Senate meeting with President Martin to understand his "vision of reorganization".

MacDonald: Regarding Pass/Fail option, how many students requested this option spring, 2020?

Llorens: Small number of requests have been received but exact number is not known.

Carlin: Concern of recent HR request for some faculty to return to campus for office hours and working on campus. Questioned that there are different expectations for faculty across the campus.

Llorens: Presently working with HR. Prefer to leave the managing process with the Chairs and Deans of the Colleges. No feedback from faculty with any significant problems. Change in policy has been reaffirmed by President Martin and he assumes it is being adhered to.

Girimurugan: If students come back after Thanksgiving and have COVID exposure or symptoms with quarantine requirements, do we give an incomplete or medical withdrawal?

Llorens: This would be between faculty and students based on progession of student in class.
