## **Introduction**

The Quarterly Briefing shall provide the Board of Trustees with a set of periodic reports and performance indicators designed to give an overview of the University's major goals and achievements in academic affairs, faculty and student body demographics, research, economic development activities, facilities development, institutional advancement, and financial management.

The Quarterly Briefing will be updated as necessary and distributed to the Board of Trustees prior to each of its quarterly meetings.

## **Notes and Highlights**

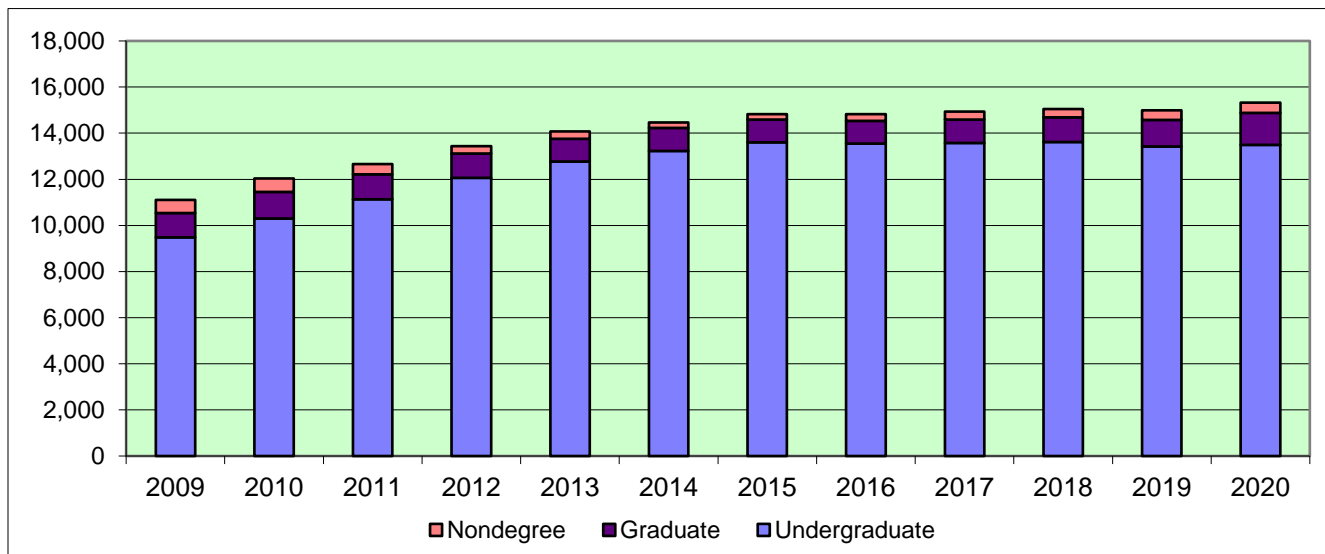
- The final fall 2020 headcount enrollment is 15,329, 2.2% above fall 2019.
- The preliminary 2020-21 annual fundable FTE is 10,101 or 2.5% above 2019-20.
- The number of new freshmen is 2,595, or 6.3% below 2019-20.
- In 2019-20, approximately 2,930 bachelor's degrees were awarded compared to 3,004 in 2018-19.
- The number of master's degrees for 2019-20 was 312, compared to 288 in 2018-19.
- FGCU awarded 49 doctorates in 2019-20, bringing the total to 341.
- Undergraduates make up 88% of the total student population.
- Freshmen make up 19% of the student body.
- Among undergraduates, 79% are full time.
- Students 24 or under represent 83.5% of the student body. The fastest rate of growth is among students age 35 to 39.
- Hispanic students make up 23% of the total student population, increasing 7.6% over last fall.
- Majors in the College of Arts and Sciences represent 38.9% of the student population.
- FGCU holds the second highest employment rate among all SUS institutions. About 82% of bachelor's in 2018-2019 were employed full-time the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2019.
- Section 4 has the 2020-21 Operating Budget. Tables 4.1 through 4.4 provide actual expenditures through 2019-20 and estimated budget for 2020-21.



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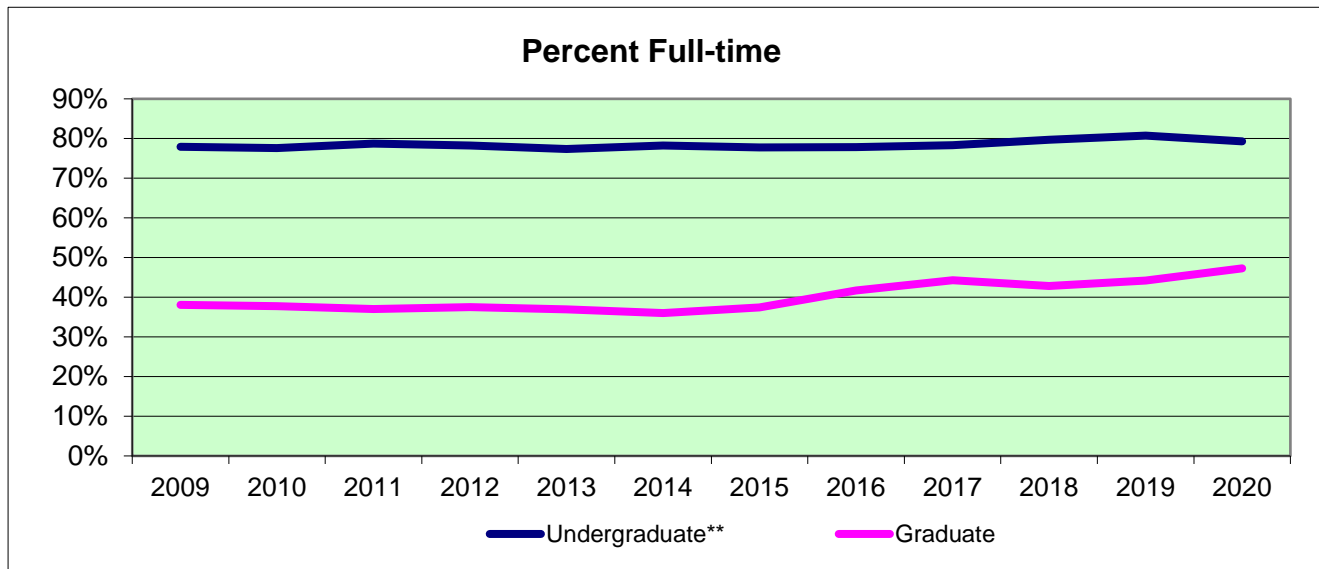

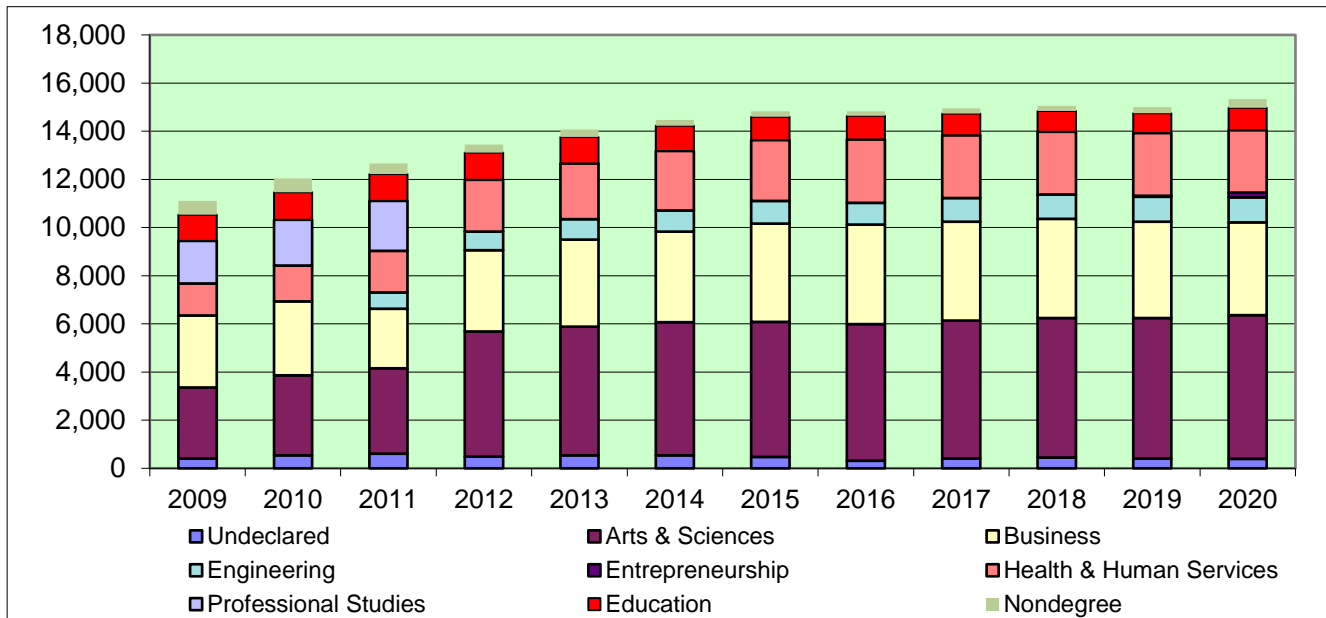

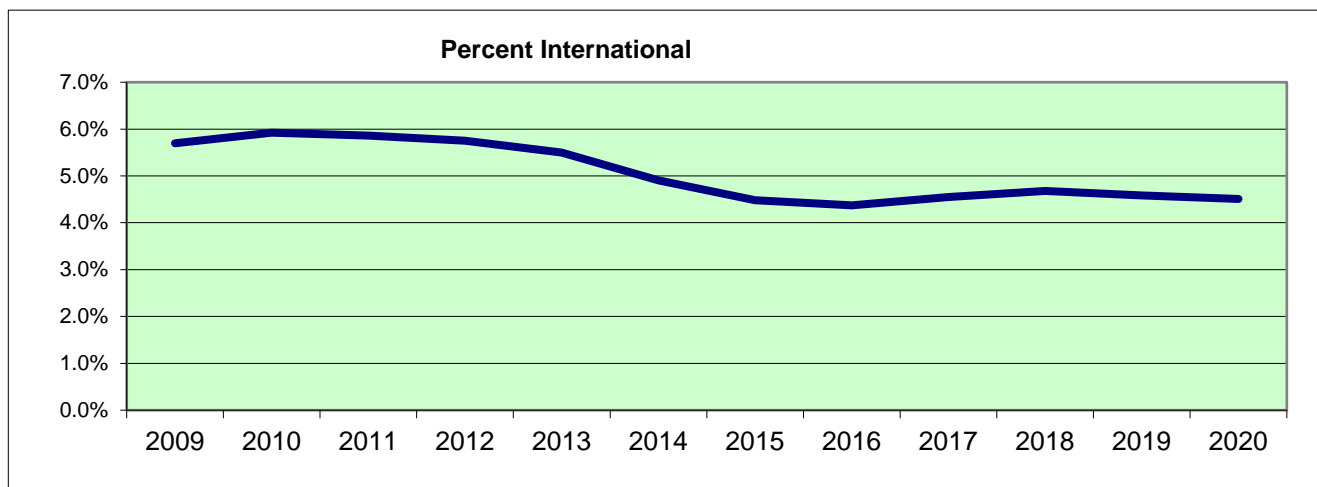

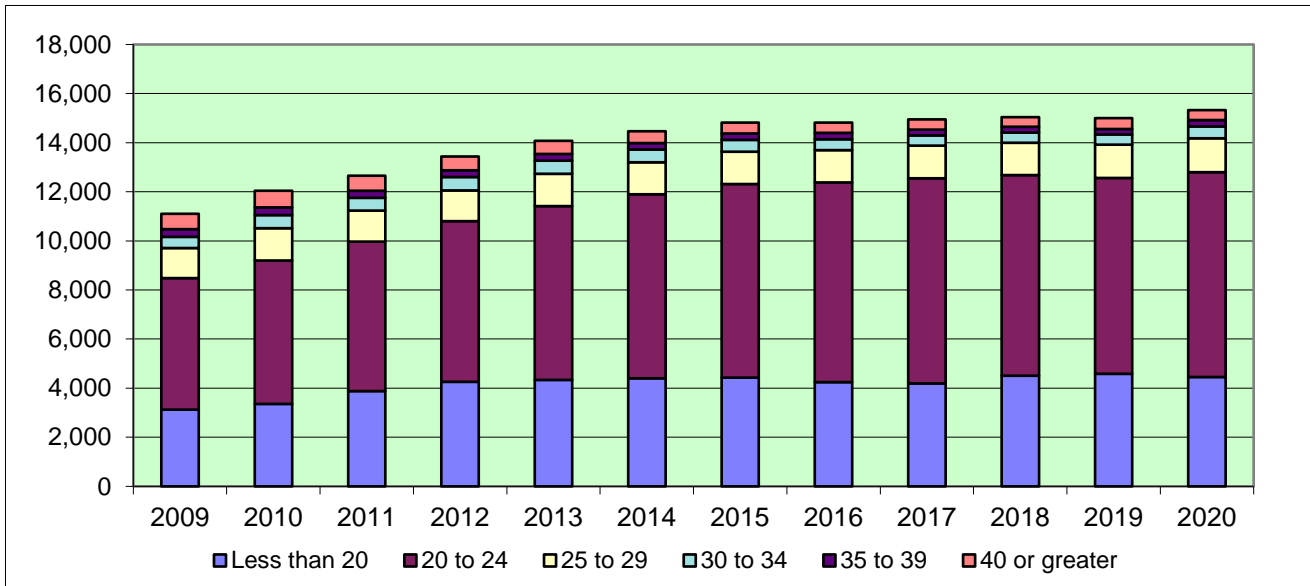

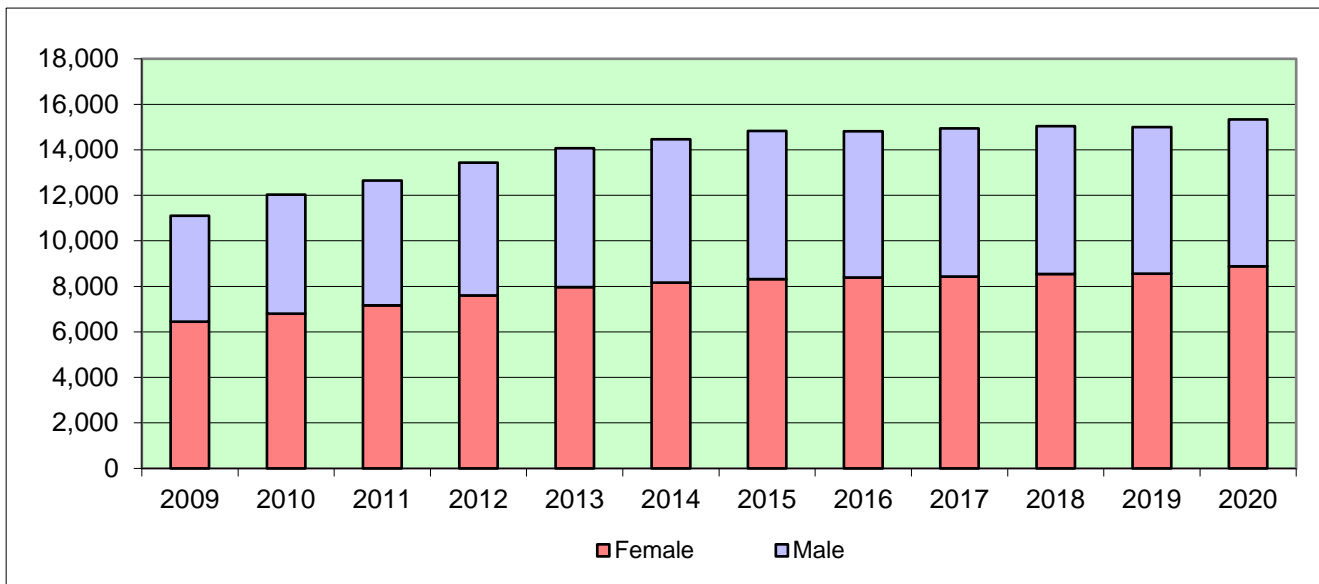

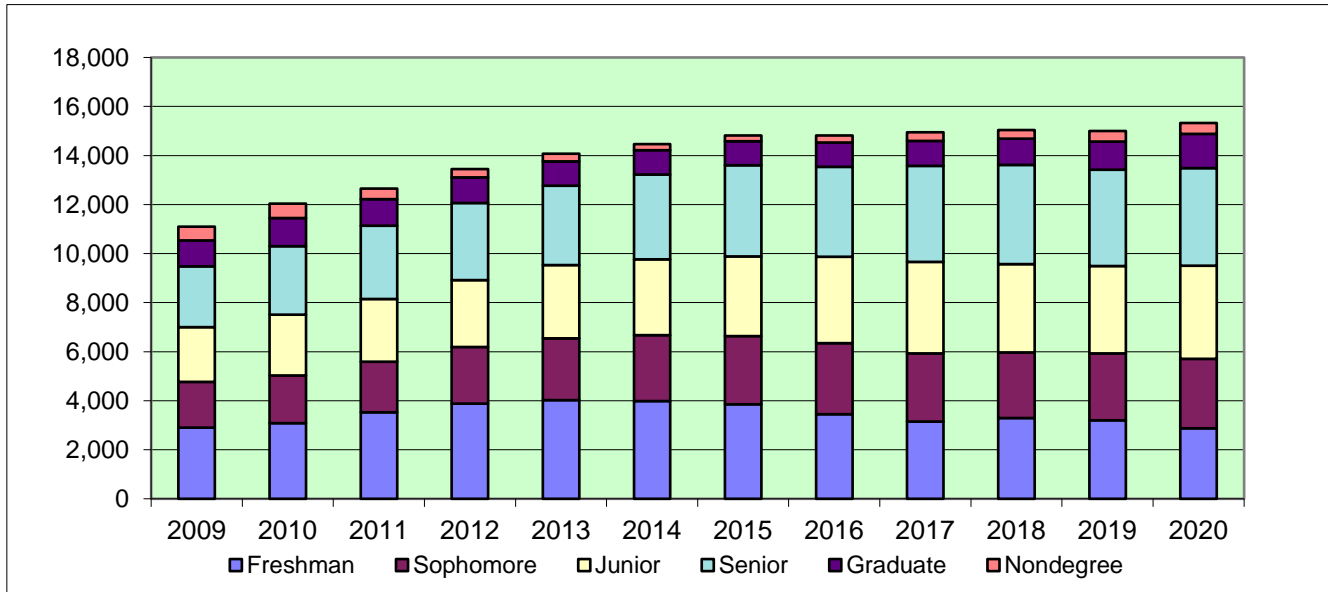

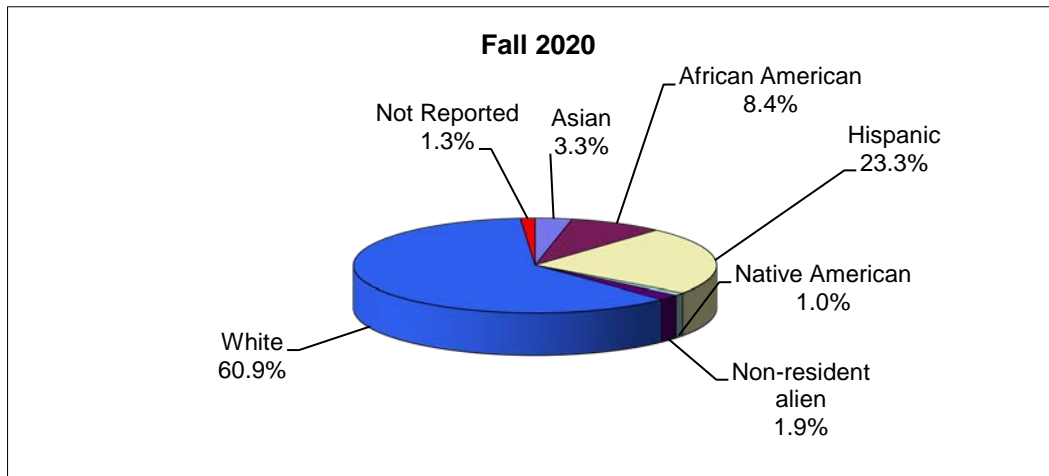

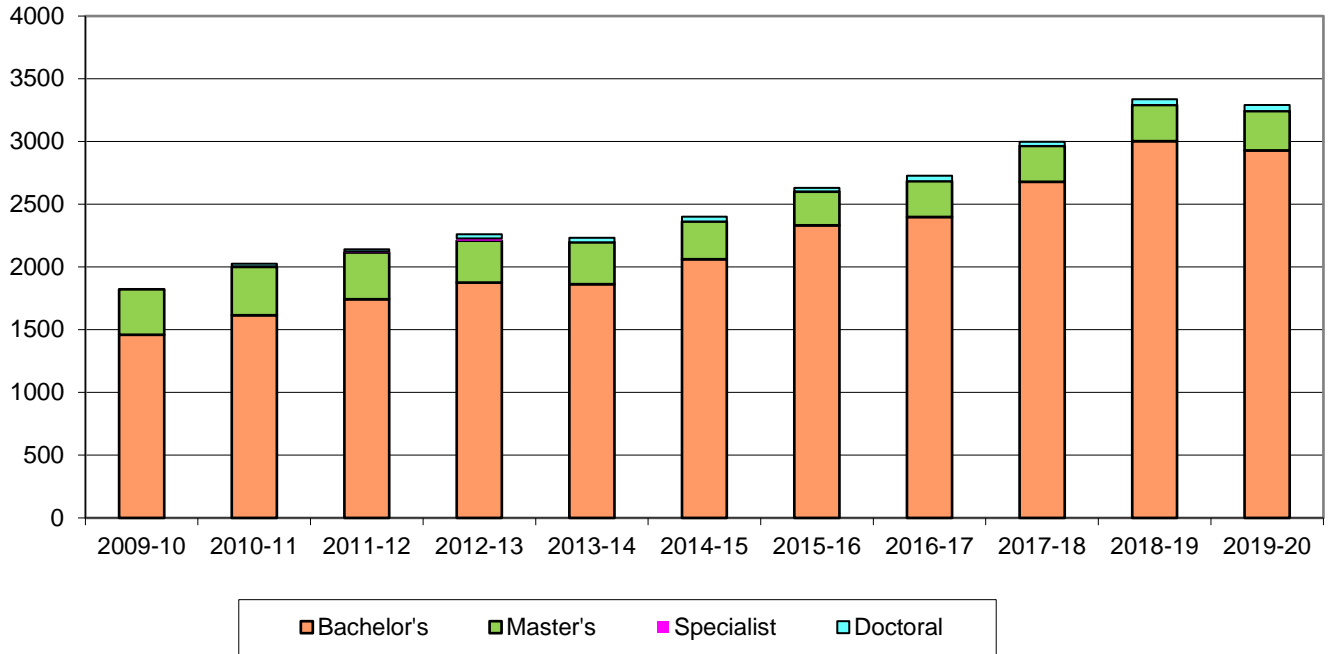

**Table 1.9 - Degrees Granted by Academic Year**



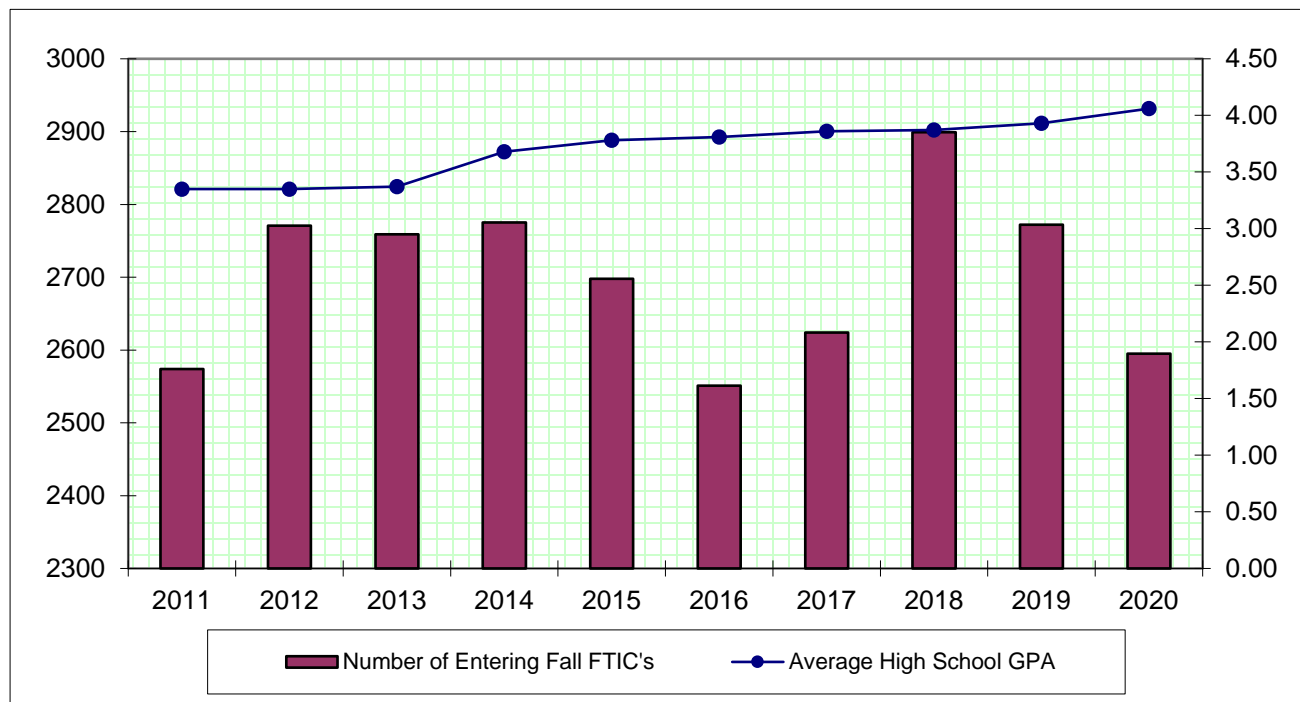

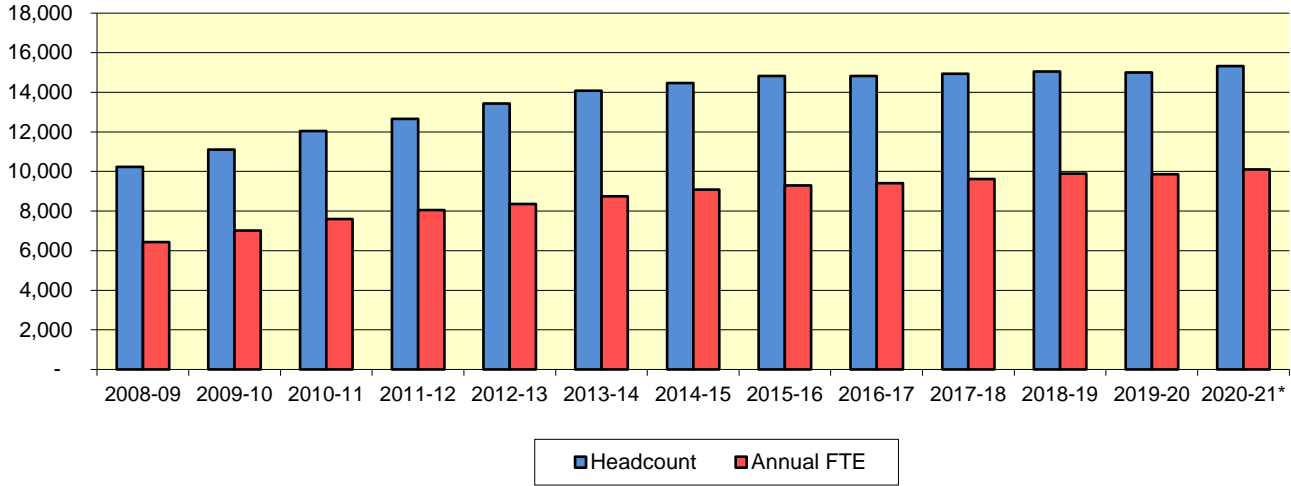

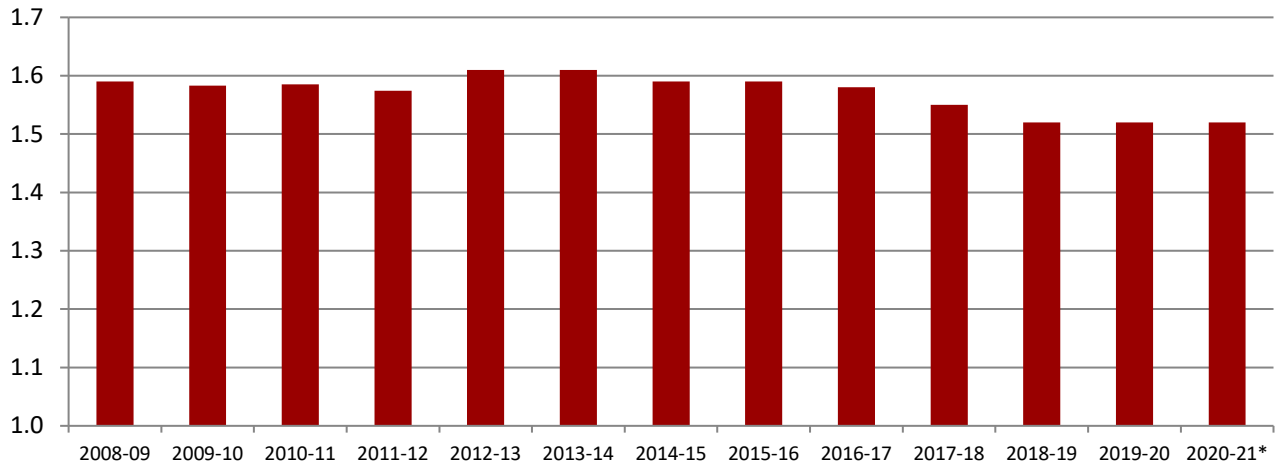

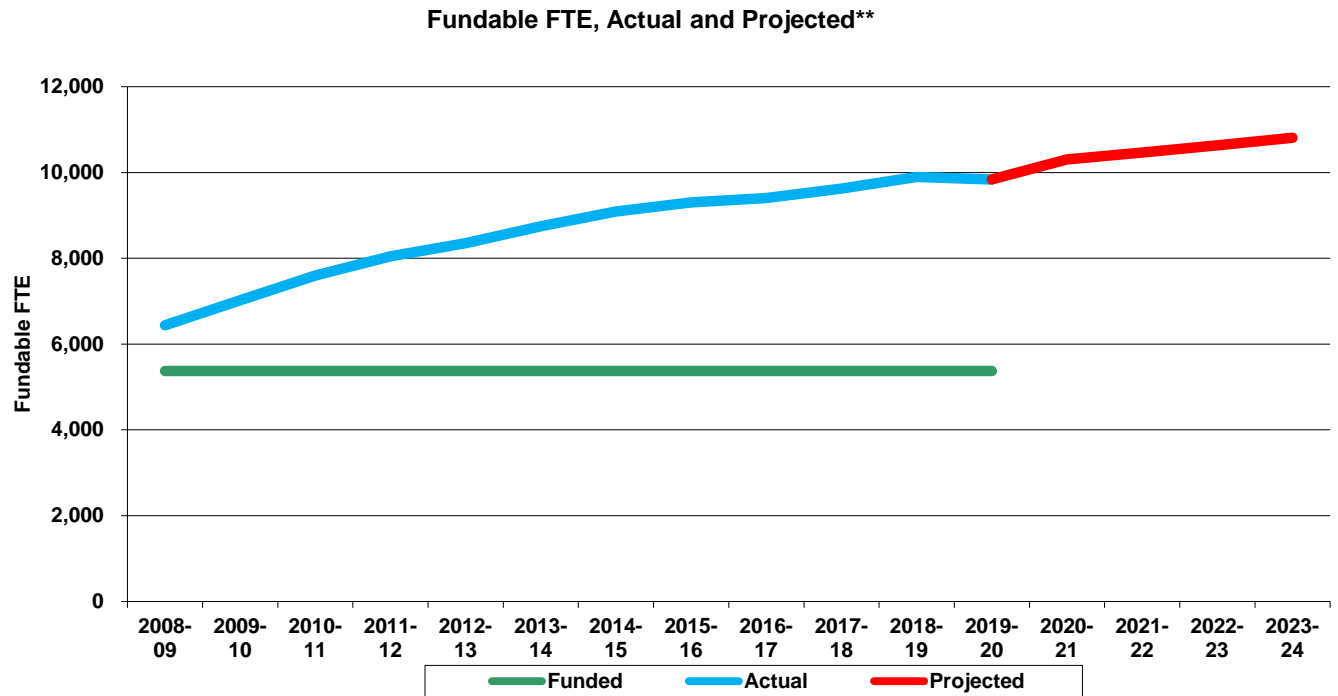

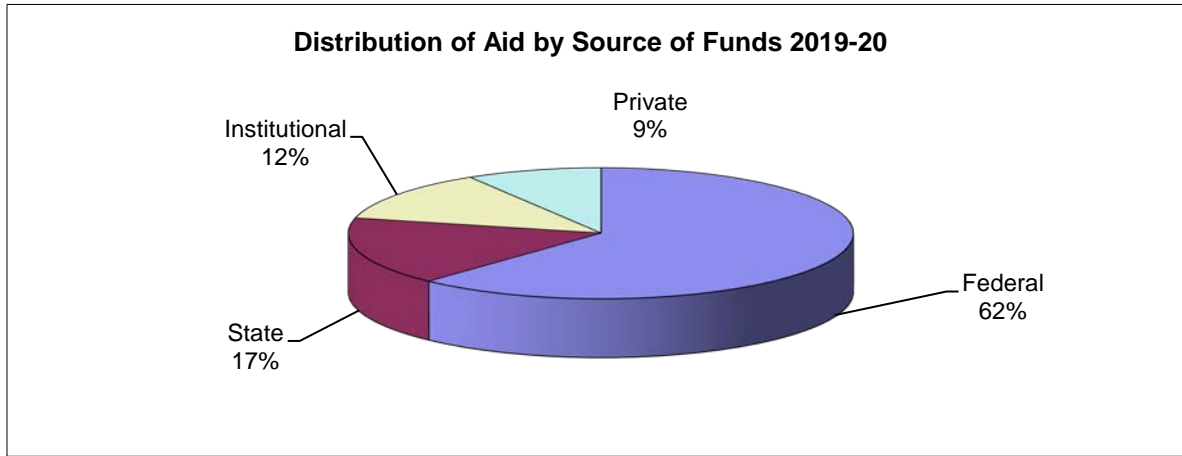

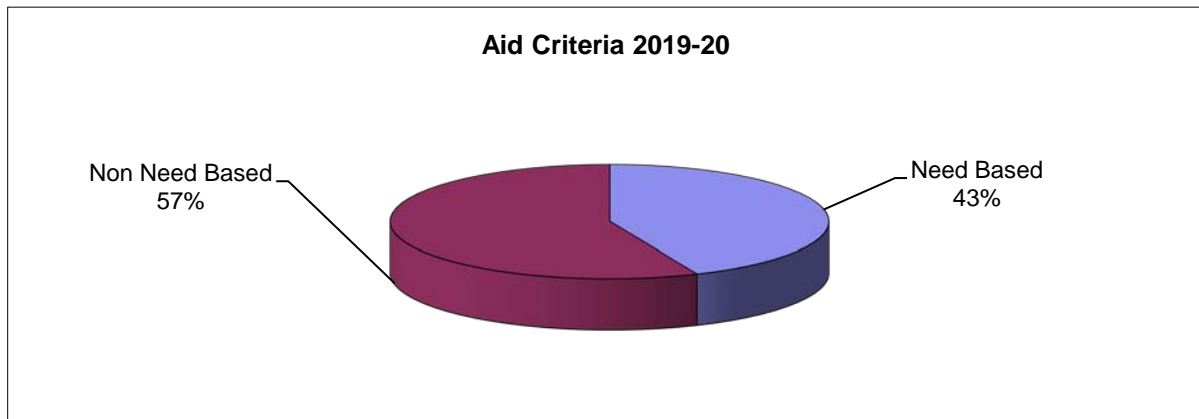

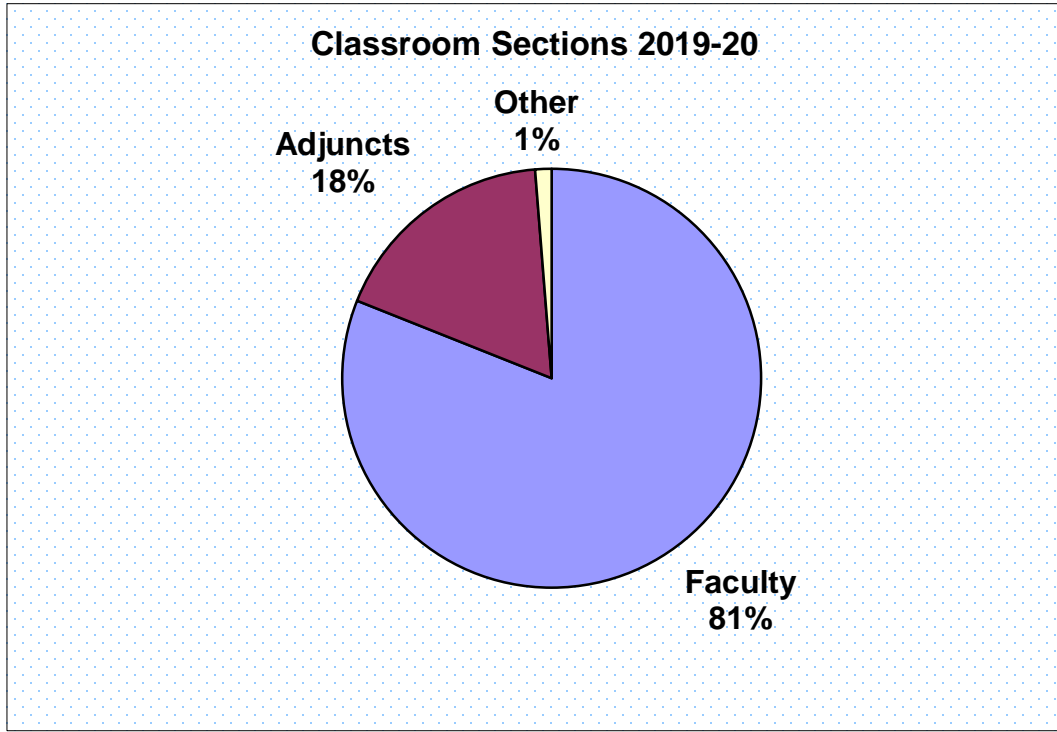

**Distribution of Classroom Sections by Faculty Type**

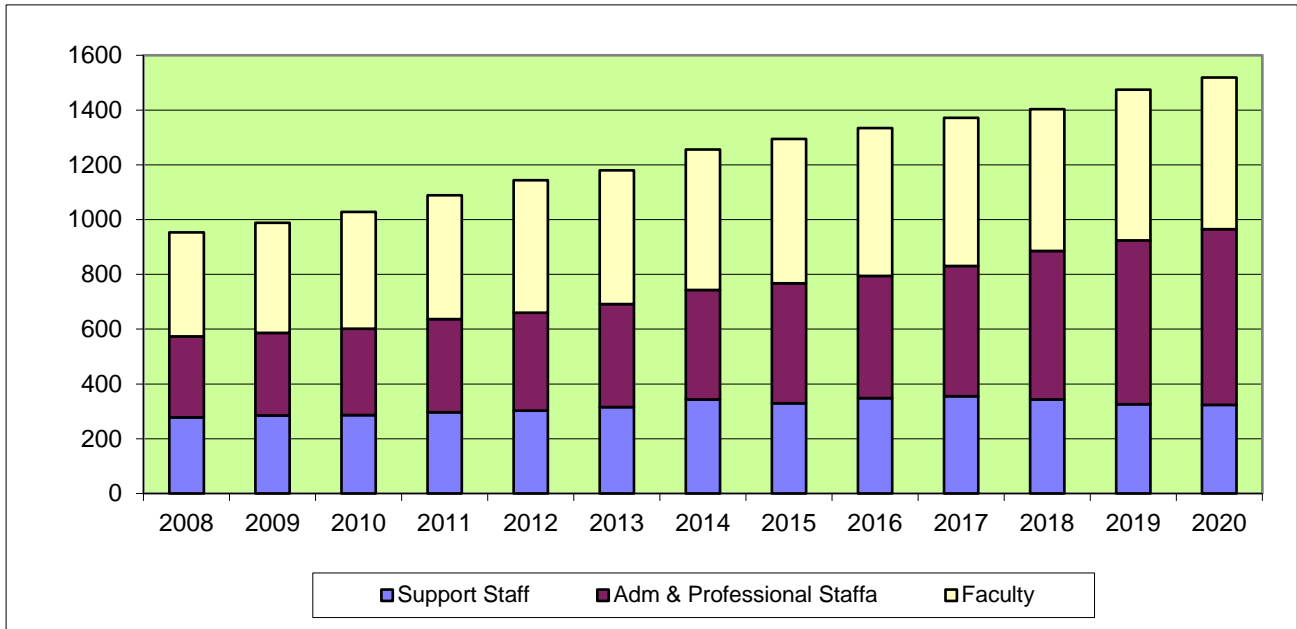

**Table 3.1 - Count of Full-time Employees**



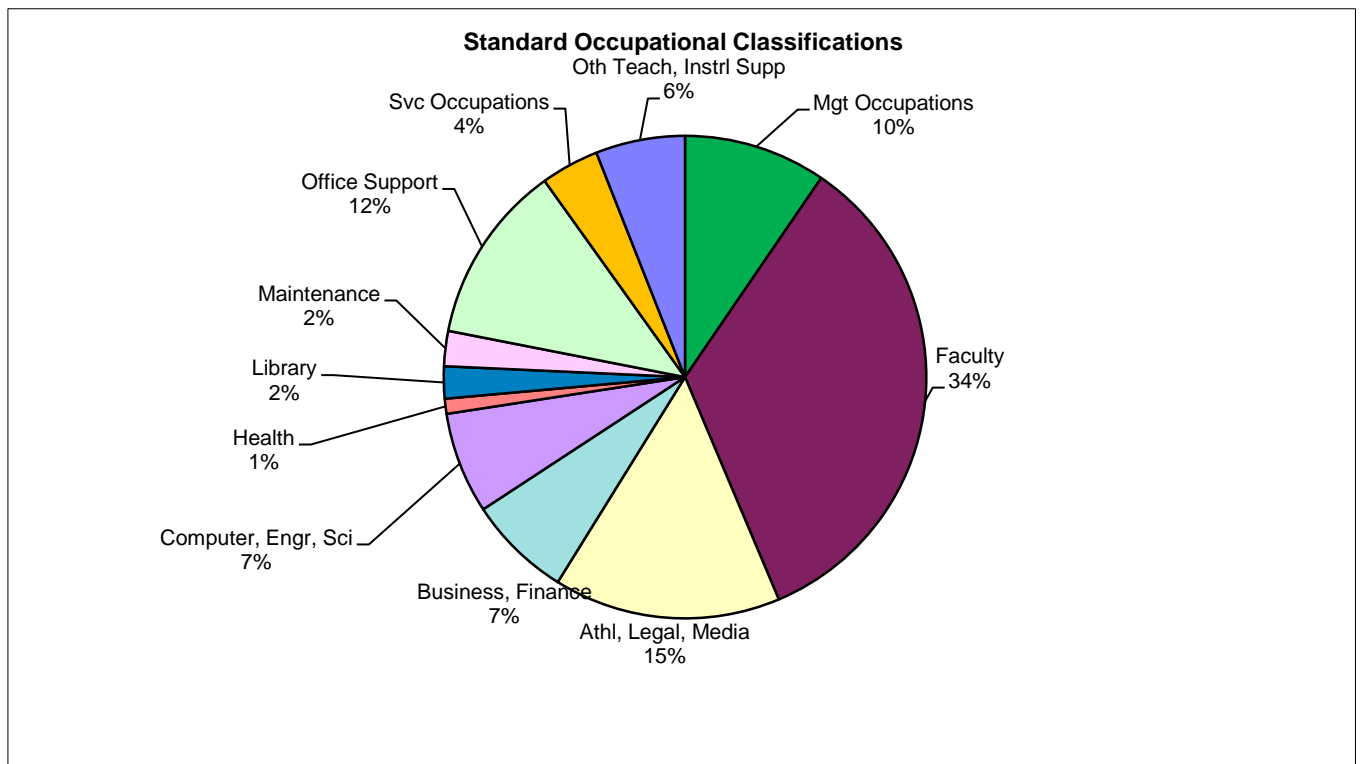
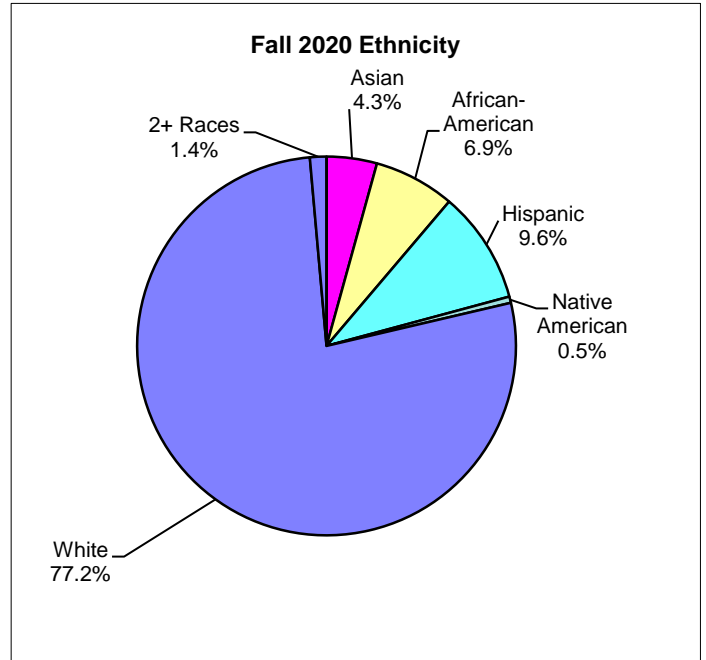
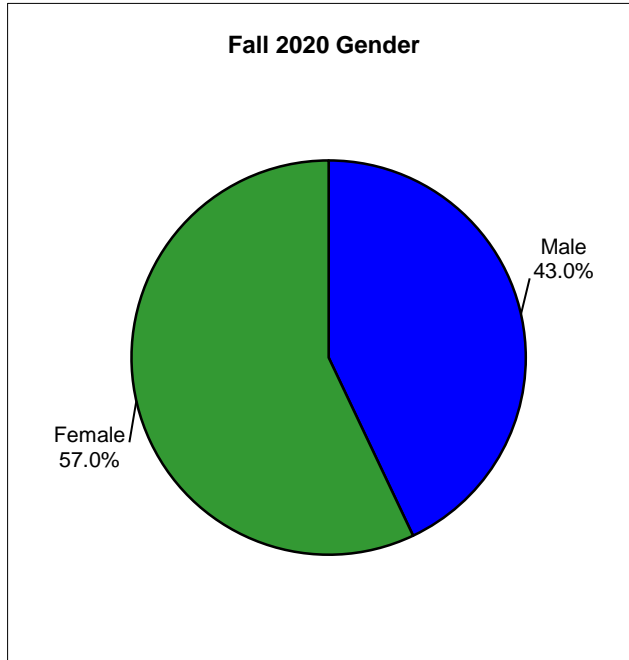

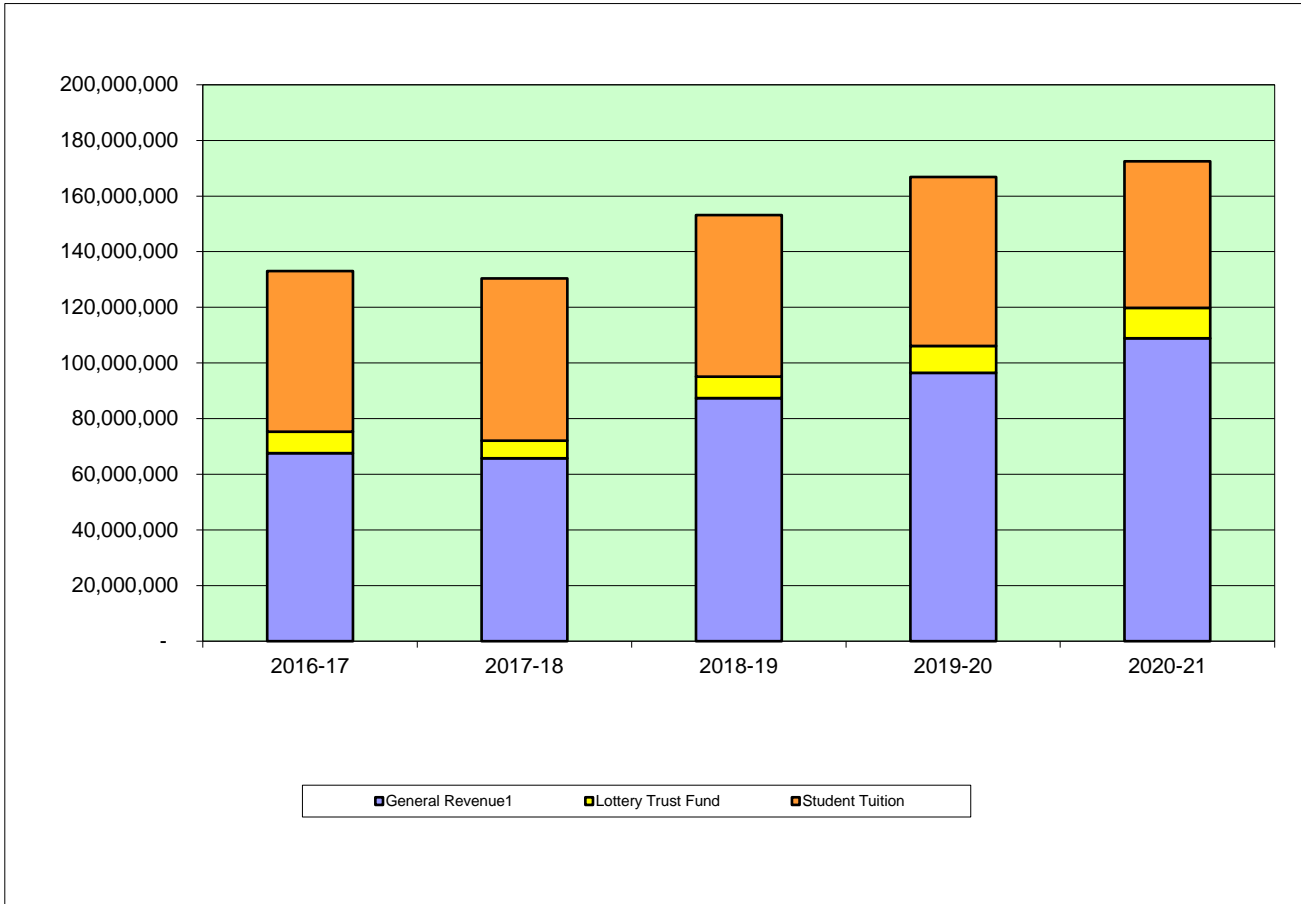
